In Rotary and in Georgia there are new initiatives to reinvigorate efforts to combat the threat of human trafficking - here in Georgia and around the world. Why? There are over 40 million enslaved people, according to [Walk Free's Global Slavery Index](#). Louise Barden and I recently participated in a local meeting of Rotarians to discuss ways we could work together to combat human trafficking.

- Georgia's First Lady Marty Kemp has initiated a project called "Georgians for Refuge, Action, Compassion, and Education" (GRACE), with a commission to combat human trafficking here in Georgia.
