Since 1946, Rotarians in Georgia, have promoted world peace through understanding by offering scholarships to international students for one year of study in Georgia colleges and universities. Georgia Rotary Clubs sponsor students recommended by a Rotary Club in their home country. The students become adopted members of a Georgia "host family,"



living on-campus at the school they attend. This is a scholarship program, not an exchange!

Each year, about 60 students from all over the world make friends in the United States and other nations and learn about differing cultures and life styles. Georgia Rotarians believe "Peace is Possible" and through GRSP promote international goodwill through friendship and understanding.

The girls were selected because they have demonstrated leadership qualities - a rare gift to be prized and cultivated.

#### ***What is RYLA?***

ROTARY YOUTH LEADERSHIP AWARD (RYLA) is a program for young people, which was officially adopted by Rotary International in 1971. The RYLA program is conducted on the district level by Rotarians to provide young people of their communities an opportunity to take part in developing qualities of leadership and good citizenship.

#### ***What will the District 6900 RYLA program be like?***

The District 6900 RYLA program will consist of a four-day leadership education experience. Participants will learn to identify their leadership styles and improve their leadership skills through a variety of experiences including indoor and outdoor activities. Some are "Survivor" style group challenges – problem-solving using limited resources, which will help each leadership style learn how groups interact and succeed. The group will learn about international volunteer organizations and activities, which offer unique opportunities in developing leadership skills. Keynote speakers will inspire and challenge participants as future leaders.
